Inspector Joe Arico gave a building report update and reviewed several long open permits. The Board discussed various issues regarding procedures for renewing permits. Attorney Anthony Guardino discussed the recent changes to the Village Code and enforcement options on expired permits.

Trustee Gulbransen discussed the pending environmental applications and the impact to the various properties, the protection of certain species such as Mountain Laurel; met with the Long Island Sound Study for potential Codes that impact and may reduce flooding within the Village.

• Will arrange to have Walter Sedovich, Modern Ruins Architect, meet with the Board to discuss the comprehensive conditional survey report on the Lighthouse submitted to the Board, possibly for the June 14th BOT meeting; possible placement of the report to the Village website; the need for a project manager.

 Working with a Columbia grad student to put the Lighthouse on the National Historic Registry, which will also enhance grant opportunities; will work with the Lighthouse Foundation on information for fundraising

Trustee Morgan Morrison -Street & Roadside Repairs: <u>Road delineators/reflectors</u>; <u>Catch basin issue near 120 OFR, contained in Hayduk Road Report</u>

- Suggested leaving the road delineators/reflectors in place all year round to save the \$900 per year cost to remove and replace; there were no objections from the Board or the residents present.
- Catch basin problem to be determined if its due to wash out or improper installation; contractor has not responded to phone calls, issue will be turned over to the Village Attorney if necessary.

Trustee Schaefer-Special Projects, Website; Handicapped ramp for the Lighthouse

• Suggested having a handicapped ramp installed at VH, even if just temporary until Lighthouse renovations are done; will be reviewing the Village website for updates and improvements.

Public Comment

Jeff Owen said although Mountain Laurel is protected, it does not preclude removal for building purposes. Christine D'Alessandro and the Environmental Committee has considered putting out printed information for living in Old Field to Real Estate agents; the Environmental Committee will work with the Welcome Committee to ensure new residents' awareness of important issues.
