Pledge to the Flag

Mayor Pirro opened the meeting at 7:00 PM and led the Pledge to the Flag.

Building

Building Inspector Joe Arico discussed several issues; a summons has been issued to 1 Woodhull cove for no site plan, and 20 Evans Lane must submit an amended site plan. Two new applications for site plans have been submitted to the Building Dept.

Lighthouse Bond Proposal and Public Comments

Mayor Pirro, after discussing the funds available for the Lighthouse renovation, introduced Bob Smith, Attorney, from Hawkins, Delafield & Wood, and Noah Nadelson; Munistat Financial Services, representatives for the proposed Bond Anticipation Note for the repairs of the Lighthouse. They gave an overview of the advantages and the flexible options to securing a Bond Anticipation Note compared to a Bond. The BAN can be renewed as needed up to five years, and could be converted into a Bond if necessary. It can be paid down within that time.

Jeff Owen remarked the costs for repairs may be understated. The Mayor said that is why he has authorized up to 2.250 million to account for increases or unforeseen costs during renovation. During the time, the Village can build up cash flow, and accept third party participation donations.

Trustee VanDerBogart said the Board is committed to not raising taxes for the Lighthouse repairs.

Jeff Schnee, President of the Three Village Historical Society, has offered to propose to his Board that the Society be a conduit for donations made specifically for the Lighthouse renovation and repairs in order to offer a tax deduction. He also discussed grant opportunities.

Tom Cottone questioned not all the phases of construction are within the Conditional Survey. Trustee VanDerBogart said the Phase I contains all the prioritized and necessary repairs, Phase II and III were left blank. She also stated Robert Muller, Lighthouse Society President, is very interested in being involved in the project. Mayor Pirro said the Engineers report should be nearly completed by March 13, 2023.

Trustee Gulbransen said the educational opportunities and museum will promote donations.

Tom Cottone asked if the Board does the approval for a Bond. Mayor Pirro replied this meeting is for that purpose. Bruce Feller congratulated the Mayor and Board on a job well done.
