Building

The Board, and Building Inspector Joe Arico, discussed the violations, conditions and solutions for 1 Woodhull Cove Lane. Attorney Anthony Guardino said while the Village can continue to issues summonses for failure to comply or violations of Code, but the Village does not have injunctive powers and cannot force a site plan. Joe Arico discussed the current Code for the renewal process for building permits. Attorney Guardino discussed possible ways of incentivizing permit holders to finish the project.

The Board of Trustees of the Incorporated Village of Old Field, Suffolk County, New York at a meeting of said Board duly called and held on **Tuesday, November 8, 2022, unanimously adopted the following resolutions** pertaining to the registration of all persons eligible to vote and the offices to be filled at the annual Village Election to be held on Tuesday, March 21, 2023:

RESOLVED, that there shall be no Village registration day for Village elections pursuant to Subdivision 3 of Section 15-118 of the Election Law, and

FURTHER RESOLVED, that only those persons registered to vote with the Board of Elections of Suffolk County shall be eligible to vote, and

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the next general election for the Incorporated Village of Old Field, Suffolk County, New York, shall be held at the Keeper's Cottage located at 207 Old Field Place in said Village on Tuesday, March 21, 2023, that the hours of opening and closing the polls thereof shall be 12:00 noon and 9:00 P.M. respectively and that during such period of nine consecutive hours the polls shall be kept open for the purpose of choosing and electing the following officers:

Two Trustee positions, each for a term of two years

RESOLVED, that the following be, and they are hereby, designated and appointed to act as Inspectors of Election for a fee of \$160.00 per person, with Carol Schraut presiding as Chairperson thereof: Carol Schraut, Chairperson and Marianne Feller.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Village be, and hereby is directed to prepare a proper notice of said annual election pursuant to Section 15-104 of the Election Law and to cause said notice to be published in said Village Times containing the date of the election and the polling place; the hours during which the polls shall be open; the names and addresses of all those who have been duly nominated whose certificate of petition of nomination has been duly filed with said Village Clerk and the term of such office for which they have been so nominated, an abstract of any proposition to be voted upon, if any, and to cause a printed copy thereof to be posted conspicuously in at least six (6) public places in the Village at least one (1) day before said election.

On a motion by Trustee Schaefer, seconded by Mayor Pirro, the following resolution was approved, 5-0.

Public Comments

Mary Ellen McCrossen, Community Relations Manager, for St. Charles Hospital and St. Catherine's, introduced herself and gave a brief statement regarding the services her office provides for individuals or their family members who have been hospitalized.

Environmental Chair Bruce Feller discussed the Boards consideration of having an arborist or landscape architect, through the office of the Village Engineer, do a final review and inspection of tree and undergrowth removals for site plans. Further discussion included how any landscape alterations could be verified to have complied with the permit issued, which would include the Environmental Committee.

Trustee VanDerBogart emphasized the need to act quickly to prevent any additional water damage to the building coming through the light housing. The Board discussed the RFQ at length, the Mayor has requested the draft be sent to R&M Engineering for their use while building a first draft of the lighthouse restoration RFP, prior to release. All Trustees are concerned with the steady deterioration of the structure and are in agreement that corrective action must be taken immediately.
